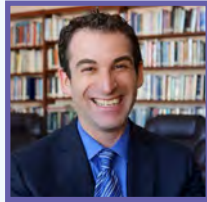

Dear friends,

This is one of those years when Chanukah begins early, very early. The first night will be Sunday, November 28. That's right - the Sunday at the end of Thanksgiving weekend. The Sunday when many will be returning from family gatherings after a tiring day of travel.

Yes, when we are tired, worn out, and perhaps just not feeling it, that's when we are to light the first candles.

People have been asking, "Can't we just light them at Thanksgiving meal - when we are all together?"

Well, of course you can light candles. And you can share the blessings. And it will be meaningful. But don't let it replace lighting the candles on Chanukah itself! There is something so magical and miraculous about being in sync with Jews throughout time and space at this season.

I am reminded of a story during the Holocaust, when inmates at the Bergen-Belsen death camp pulled threads from their tattered clothes for candles, stole a match from a kitchen, used potato skins as a Chanukiah, and carved dreidels from wooden shoes. These inmates were beyond heroic, and their story reminds me each year to honor the season in it's proper time.

It's so always easy. But neither is life.

So, if you are traveling. And if you are arriving home Sunday at midnight. And if you have already lit candles when you family was together Do it again, before you go to bed. Because keeping the light alive in the face of all odds ... well, that is the miracle of Chanukah!

Cantor's Corner



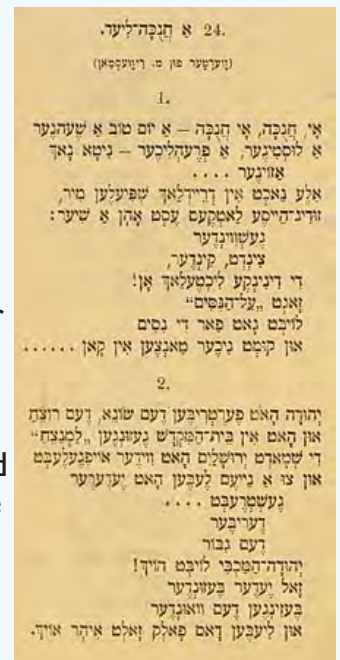
Did you know that the beloved song, "Oh Chanukah Oh Chanukah" has been around for over a hundred years? This has been a staple of Chanukah celebrations at home and Jewish institutions for many generations. It was originally written in Yiddish by Mordkhe (Mark) Rivesman, and first published in Susman Kiselgof's 1912 Lider-Zamlbukh. The song most likely was being performed as early as 1909 and published later in 1912.

I remember singing this song as a child at all of our Chanukah celebrations at home, dancing and singing around the house. We sang this every year in my dad's children's choir – Hasharim as well. My sister and I along with a few other members of Hasharim even recorded this song when we were little for a record of Chanukah songs.

After my family and I light our Chanukah candles each night, this is the first song that we sing. It's been such a joy seeing my children light up and sing and dance around the house in the same way I did as a child. I make sure this is a part of our Chanukah Service line-up each year as well. I love incorporating the original Yiddish words as well as the English words we have all come to love.

We will be singing this melody once again at our Chanukah Shabbat Shira service on Friday, December 3. Now more than ever we need light in our lives, we need light to guide us through the difficult times we're living in. We hope you can join us for this special service.

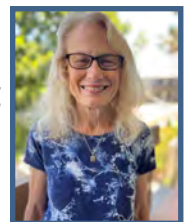
For having your kids join our engaging TASTY events, led by Leah Penso, Youth Group Director.

Sustaining the Light:

Social Justice for Chanukah

In the middle of winter, we gather together around the Chanukah lights, spin the dreidle, eat latkes and jelly donuts, celebrating the festival of Chanukah. Chanukah takes its name of 'dedication' from the Maccabees' rededication of the Temple after their battle against King Antiochus. By returning to and reclaiming the Temple, the Maccabees recommitted themselves to a Jewish way of life, to all that they held dear. Thus, Chanukah asks us to rededicate ourselves not only to our Judaism, but to the values we place at the center of our faith. In particular, Chanukah can be a time when we rededicate ourselves to the work of tikkun olam, repair of the world.

As the Maccabees had the courage to stand up for their beliefs, Chanukah encourages us to speak out about our values. The rabbis teach us to not only kindle the holiday lights in the privacy of our homes, but also to make known the miracles of Chanukah by placing our hanukiyot in the window. As our ancestors worked to keep the light in the Temple burning from generation to generation, we work towards creating a just society that will endure from generation to generation – a society in which all of its members live in a dignified way, which preserves the environment and our natural resources, which protects and nurtures our children, and which continues to be a beacon of religious freedom.

As we increase the lights of Chanukah, adding a candle each night, so too might we, by our actions, bring new light to the world: light to those living in poverty, light for our fragile ecosystems, light for all of our children and the light of religious liberty.
