## Shalom, Rav



Dear all,

I want to share a Holy Day story from my days as a student rabbi. This was shared with me by a mentor, but I feel like it has become my own, so I will share it in the first person!

When I first served this pulpit in a small Midwest town, I reached out to the congregation to ask about specific traditions that were important to the community.

“Whatever you want” they said!

Well, I prepared meaningful services for both Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur. At the very end, I stood tall and proud on the Bimah to offer the final shofar blast, tekiya gedolah. (The person who usually sounded the shofar was ill that year).

The services were well received. (A few people noted that I chose melodies they were not familiar with). But nearly all members were disappointed in the final shofar blast.

“You are supposed to do it bowing into the Ark.”

I had never heard of this before. But they insisted that this was the right “traditional” way of doing it.

So I visited the man who had been sounding shofar in prior years. When I explained the issue, his face turned bright red. He then spoke up: “Four years ago, I was sounding shofar at the end of Yom Kippur, tall and proud. Then, my dentures fell out and onto the Bima. I was so embarrassed that I have been bowing into the Ark ever since! The first year, people thought it was strange. The second year, it was familiar. Last year, it was as though this is how Moses did it on Sinai!”

I always laugh at this story. It shows how quickly something becomes sacred tradition. Friends, my hope and prayer is this.... As we gather online for a second year for the Holy Days, I DON'T want this to become our new norm. While we will strive to foster deep meaning and harness hope and spirit, we can't wait to be back, in person, with our community. And while we may present new opportunities that become traditions, we hope these years of exclusive online worships fade into distant memory as we emerge from the pandemic.

# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

## TEMPLE COVID POLICY

As we approach the High Holy Days, all of us had hoped that we would be looking at COVID-19 in our rear view mirrors. Instead, with the increased rates of the Delta Strain, we have had to once again look at our COVID-19 procedures. As always, the health and safety of our members, staff, clergy and guests are of the utmost important to all of us, and after careful review, and with the recommendation of our COVID-19 Task Force, the Board has instituted the following COVID-19 Temple policy:

**All those who come on Temple Akiba property, participate in our youth or camp programs, or attend a Temple-sponsored event offsite, need to be fully masked at all times whether indoors or outdoors.**

**In addition, everyone who is vaccinated will need to show proof of vaccination.**

**For those who do not have proof of being fully vaccinated, they will need to do one of the following:**

- **For those who are coming to Temple on a regular basis (i.e. religious school participants), they will need to provide proof of a weekly negative PCR test result.**
- **For anyone coming to the Temple for a single event (i.e. B'nai Mitzvah) will need to provide proof of a Negative PCR test each time you come to the Temple or a Temple-sponsored event. The test would need to be administered within 72 hours of coming to the Temple or such event.**

By following these steps, you will be playing a big part in helping to ensure the healthy and safety of the Temple Akiba Community, and beyond. We will continue to monitor the situation, and will communicate with you when there are changes to this policy.

COVID has been challenging to all of us, and it has made my transition to Temple Akiba interesting. Thank you for making me feel so welcome to our community. It is an honor to be with all of you as together we ensure our **Light Shines Brighter!** I wish you all a very happy, healthy, and sweet new year!

# ECC & RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

## School Decisions During Covid-19 Balancing Our Needs and Our Jewish Values

In normal times, we're approaching that time of the year when we're all becoming eager to send our kids back to school and resume a normal routine. But, these are not normal times, and back-to-school for the 2021-2022 school year will be anything but routine. As schools and parents across the country struggle with what the school year will look like — another round of distance learning? In-person classes with no social distancing measures in place?

The best-laid plans... Since the pandemic began, the word “unprecedented” has been in near-constant use. And with good reason: Part of what makes this time so challenging is living in a world of utter uncertainty. When it comes to the approaching school year, there are so, so many questions: What rules and precautions will be in place when our kids are go back to school? We can arm ourselves by creating and presenting multiple options to ourselves and our children. This is a way of assuring ourselves, and our kids, that we will figure something out.

Still, keep in mind that whatever is figured out, it will probably need to be refigured over and over again. While this lack of firm plans can be particularly challenging for some, try to present this new, flexible mode of decision making as your new structure.

Different parents have different needs and standards.

Some parents are struggling to parent while working long hours; some parents wish that they were gainfully employed. Even if we are “all in this together” when it comes to coronavirus, everyone is also struggling with certain specific, unique realities — including immunocompromised family members, unemployment, mental health emergencies, deaths of loved ones, and so on. This personal baggage is also coupled with our understanding and expectations of what we, as parents, should be doing when it comes to our kids' schooling. That's a lot of layers —the notion that there are “70 faces” of the Torah. In other words, there are 70 different perspectives on understanding, interpreting, and observing the Torah. According to this Jewish rule of thumb, we can all be right.

Take care of yourself.

There's no playbook here, and there are no wrong or right answers. We are all balancing so many factors, including our own needs, our loved ones' needs, and, yes, strangers' needs. Remember the last time you were on an airplane and were instructed to first put on your own mask before helping others? We are all in this together, but we need to find some balance and help ourselves, too. Be compassionate and kind to yourselves so that you can do the same for your children and others.

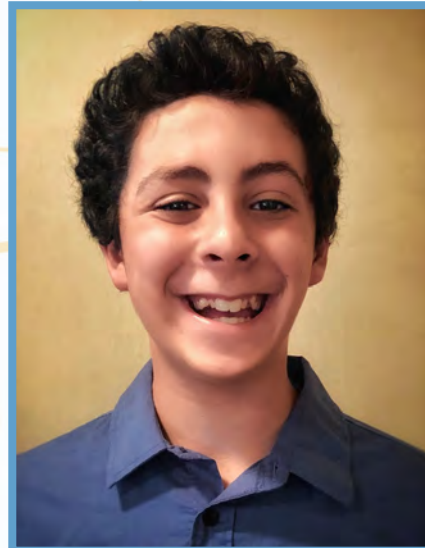

# Notes from the Tikkun Olam Committee

This committee was formed in 2018 to coordinate Temple-wide social action in accordance with our mission to repair the world. Our focus is on homelessness and hunger, immigration, and systemic policy change. We recently developed the following advocacy policy for the Temple:

## Advocacy Policy for Temple Akiba

Approved July 21, 2021

### Source of issues

- Individual congregants
- Temple groups
- Clergy and staff
- Tikkun Olam committee members
- Affiliated, trusted organizations (URJ, RAC, RAC-CA, WRJ, NFTB, HIAS, Westside Coalition on Homelessness, etc.)

### Criteria for consideration

- Aligns with Jewish values and Congregation's stated purpose
- Benefits individuals or groups of interest to Congregation
- Reflects a public policy issue (the Temple cannot support candidates or parties)

### Process

- Consideration by the Tikkun Olam Committee
- Support or opposition determined by Committee vote
- Review by Rabbi, Executive Director and Temple Board if supported by the Committee
- Action taken with advice of the Rabbi and Executive Director and approval of Temple Board
- "Fast track" – Approval by Rabbi, Executive Director and Board President if time sensitive. No Temple Board vote required.

### Types of action to be considered

- Inform Congregation of issue and encourage individual action
- Educate Congregation on the issue (Bulletin articles, forums, etc.)
- Lobby by committee members and/or interested congregants at local, state or federal level
- Submit testimonies or letters on behalf of the Congregation to decision-making bodies
- Develop a statement, on behalf of the Congregation, for local or regional press release
- Encourage other organizations to join us in action
- Collaborate with affiliated organizations

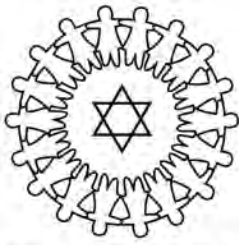
